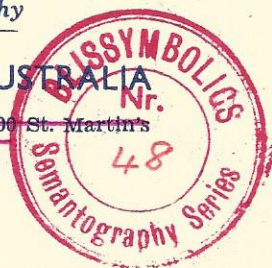

Address You may have already in your library books and brochures on Semantography and previously sent issues of the Semantography Series.
